

Oilfield Driver Awareness (ODA)

AS PER WORKSAFE BC REGULATIONS 23.22: A DRIVER IN THE OIL AND GAS INDUSTRY MUST, BEFORE OPERATING A VEHICLE WITH A GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT RATING GREATER THAN 5500KG (12 000LB),

- A.) Be certified in the applicable Energy Safety Canada driver course acceptable to the board, or
- B.) Have completed driver training providing skills and knowledge for safe driving equivalent to or better than those required by paragraph (a).

Prerequisite: Student must present government issued photo identification at time of registration for this course. Must be 16 years or older.

Valid: 3 years, Recognized Canada wide

This course is designed to provide information and techniques that will help drivers be motivated to want to change their driving behaviors and attitude. Students will learn techniques to become a more defensive driver and gain knowledge of the rules of the road and how to recognize increased risk when engaging in high risk driving behaviors.

Course description:

- Scanning skills & proper use of eyes
- Six conditions of driving
- Regulations & Policies
- The standard accident prevention formula

- Off Highway driving techniques
- Road conditions & Hazards
- Journey management

This course is approved by Alberta Transportation as a Professional Driver Improvement Course (PDIC). Participants with an Alberta Operator's License who receive 80% or better on the written examination are eligible for a reduction of up to three demerit points from their driving record from Alberta Transportation through any Alberta registries agent.
